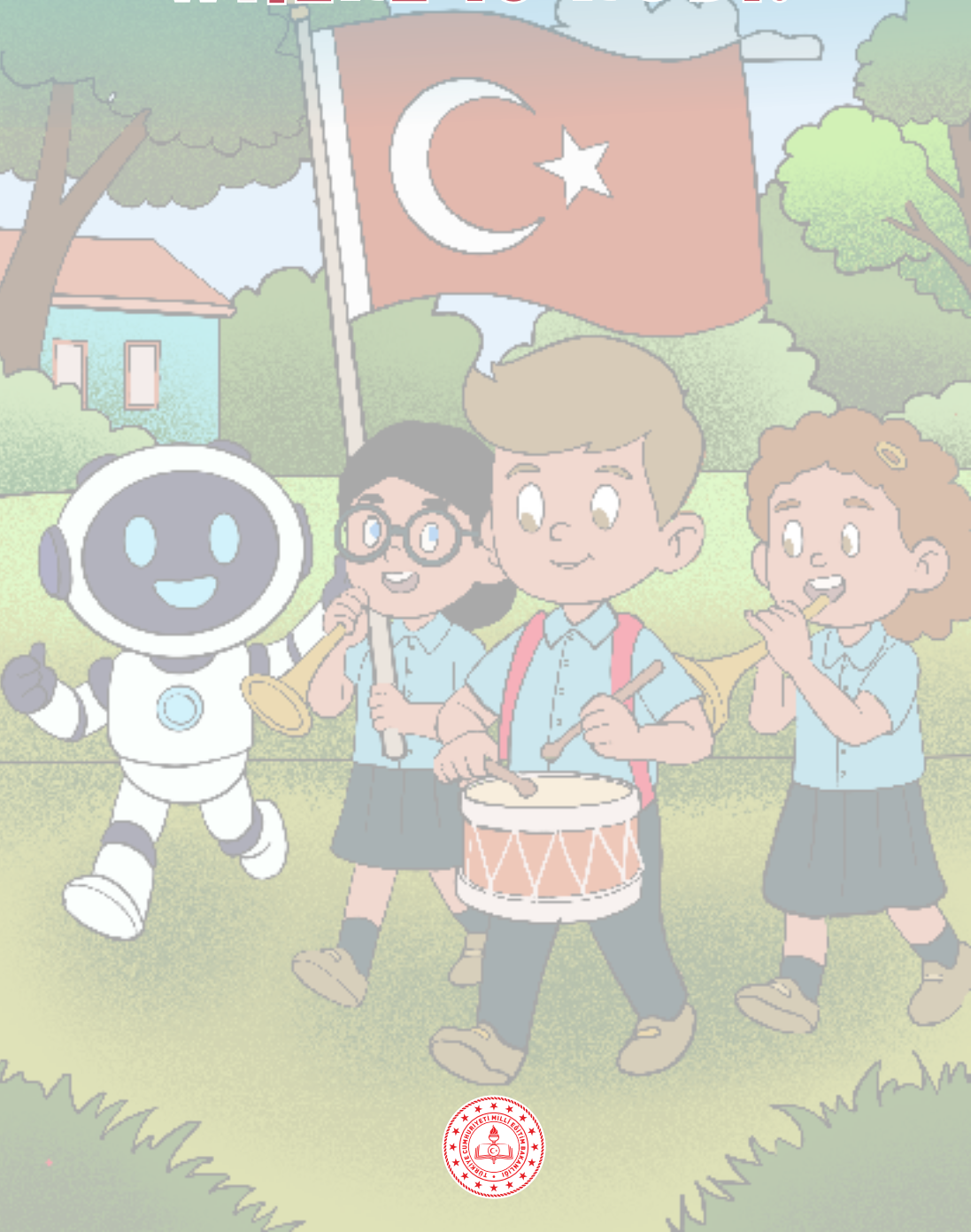

“Hello everyone! This is my robot. It is my IT project. It can walk and talk.”

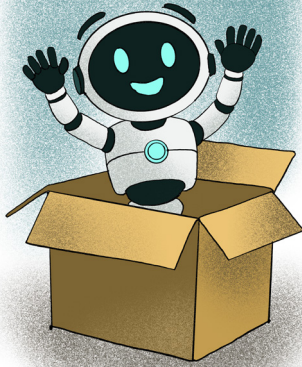

"Seriously? Can it sing, Mete?" asks Ellie.

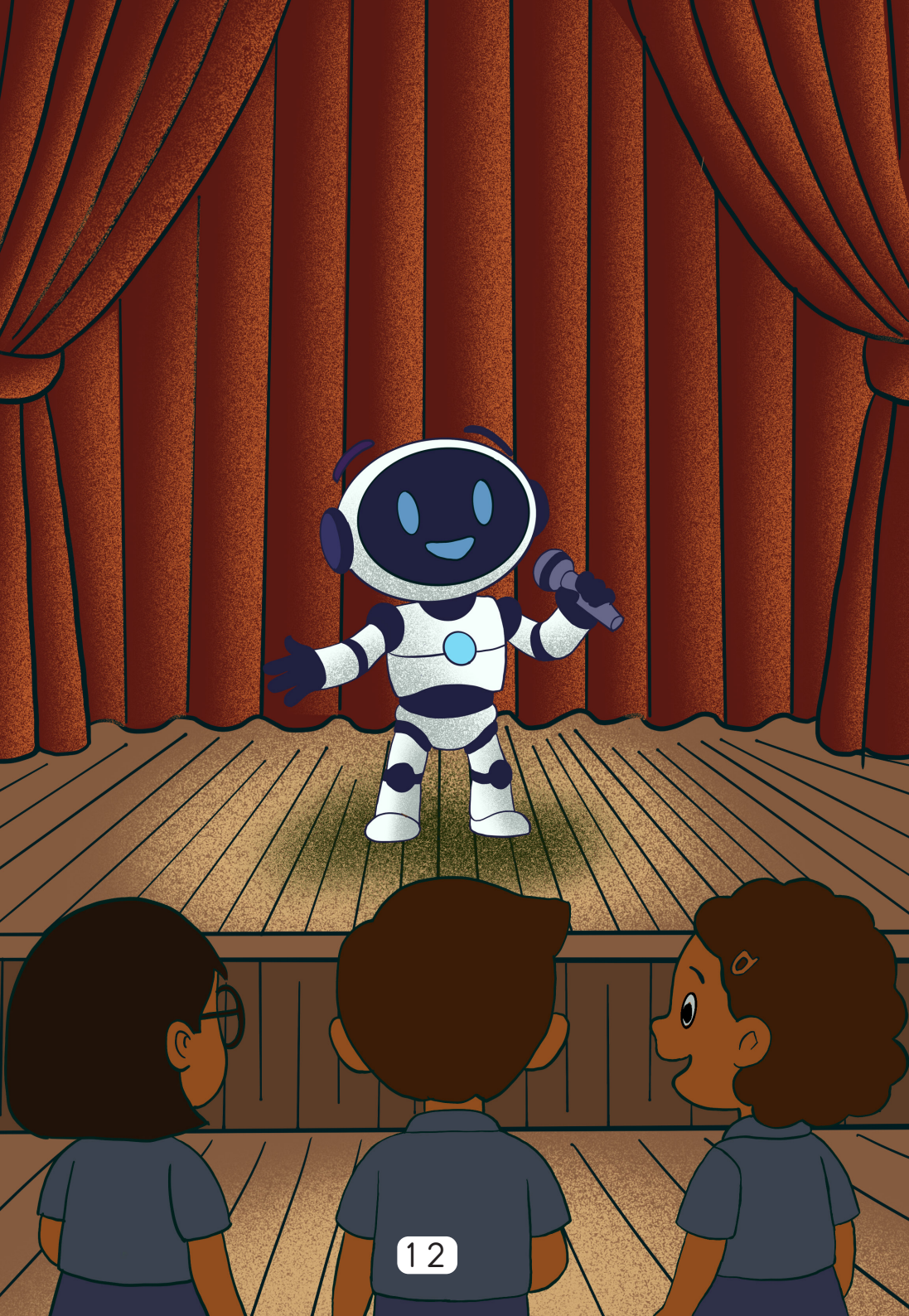
"Why not? It can even solve Maths problems," answers Mete.

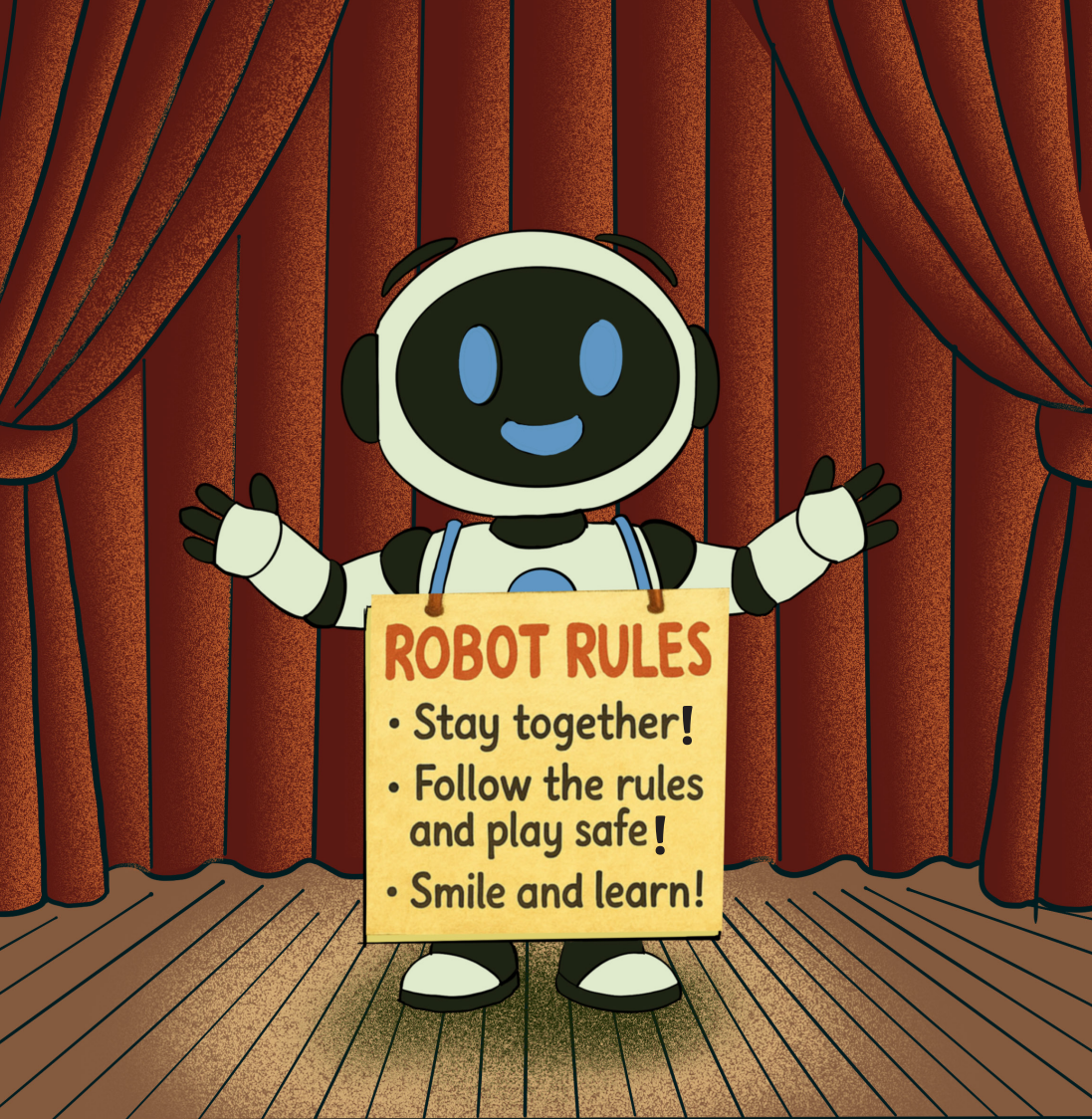
*"Let's have fun and explore,

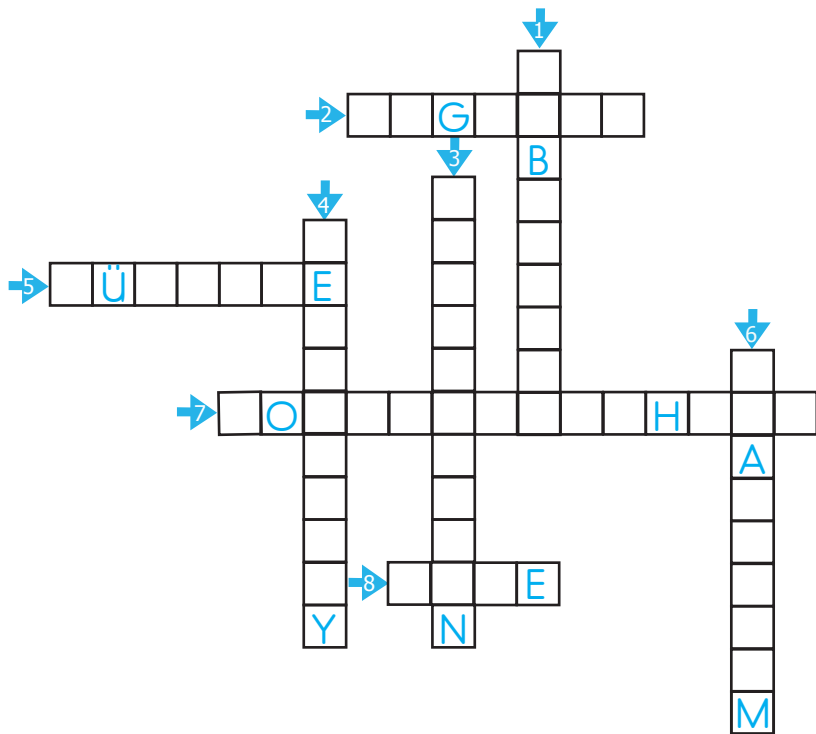
