The students return from their half-term holiday. The school courtyard is full of cheerful voices. Everyone shares stories about their break.

Mr Clark smiles and says, “Rise and shine, time to enjoy school! Techno Kids Week has arrived. Your dream inventions will be displayed at the school exhibition. What a great start to the second term!”

The students laugh and talk as they walk into the school. Some of them carry small projects or books in their hands. Emma sees her friends and waves happily.

“I missed everyone,” she says.

“Me too!” replies Mia. “Let’s make something amazing this week!”

Mr Clark claps his hands to get their attention.

“You will all work in small groups,” he explains.

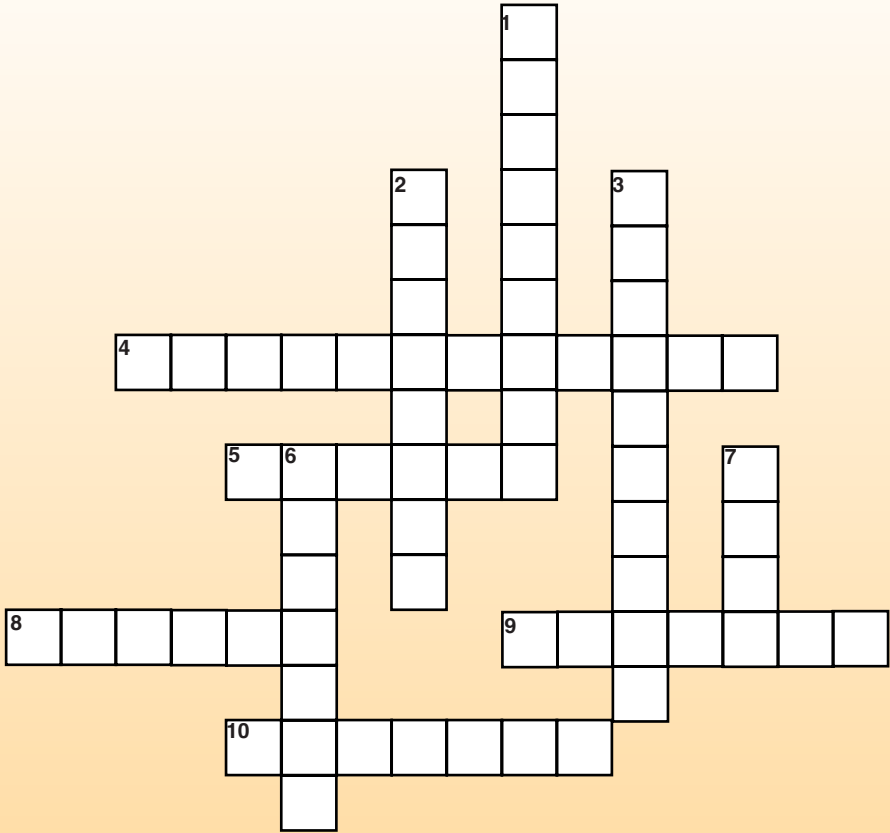
