Suddenly, Eda looks at Lily's hair.

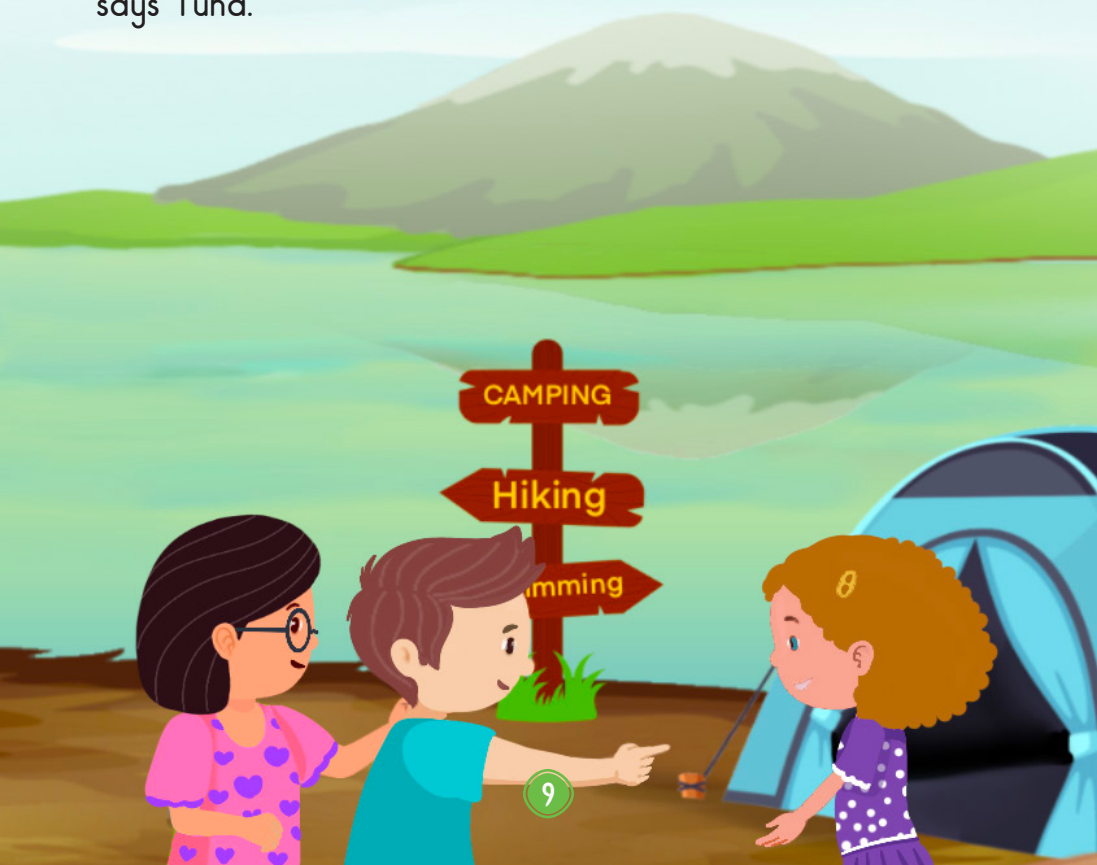
"Oh, look at your hair! It looks lighter! You have got curly fair hair now!" says Eda.

adj: adjective

adv: adverb

arm (n): the part of your body between your shoulder and your hand

board game (n): a game played on a board with pieces or cards

boots (n): strong shoes that cover your feet and lower legs

camera (n): a device used to take photos or make videos

camping (n): the activity of sleeping in a tent outdoors

cap (n): a soft hat with a flat top and a peak

comfortable (adj): making you feel relaxed and not in pain

cool (adj): a little cold in a pleasant way; also, nice or good

costume (n): special clothes worn for fun or to look like someone else

curly (adj): having many small, round shapes or waves

cycling (n): the activity of riding a bicycle

fair (adj): treating people equally and in a right way

guitar (n): a musical instrument with strings you play with your fingers

handbag (n): a small bag used by women to carry things

hat (n): a piece of clothing worn

on the head

holiday (n): a time when you do not work and can relax or travel

jacket (n): a piece of clothing you wear on the top of your body

jeans (n): trousers made of strong, usually blue, denim cloth

jumper (n): a warm piece of clothing that covers the top of your body

leg (n): the part of your body from your hip to your foot

raincoat (n): a coat that keeps you dry in the rain

scarf (n): a piece of cloth women wear on the head or neck

shirt (n): a piece of clothing for the upper body with buttons

skirt (n): a piece of clothing women or girls wear from the waist down

tent (n): a shelter made of cloth used for sleeping outside

T-shirt (n): a short-sleeved casual shirt

umbrella (n): a thing you hold to stay dry when it rains

watch (n): a small clock that you wear on your wrist
