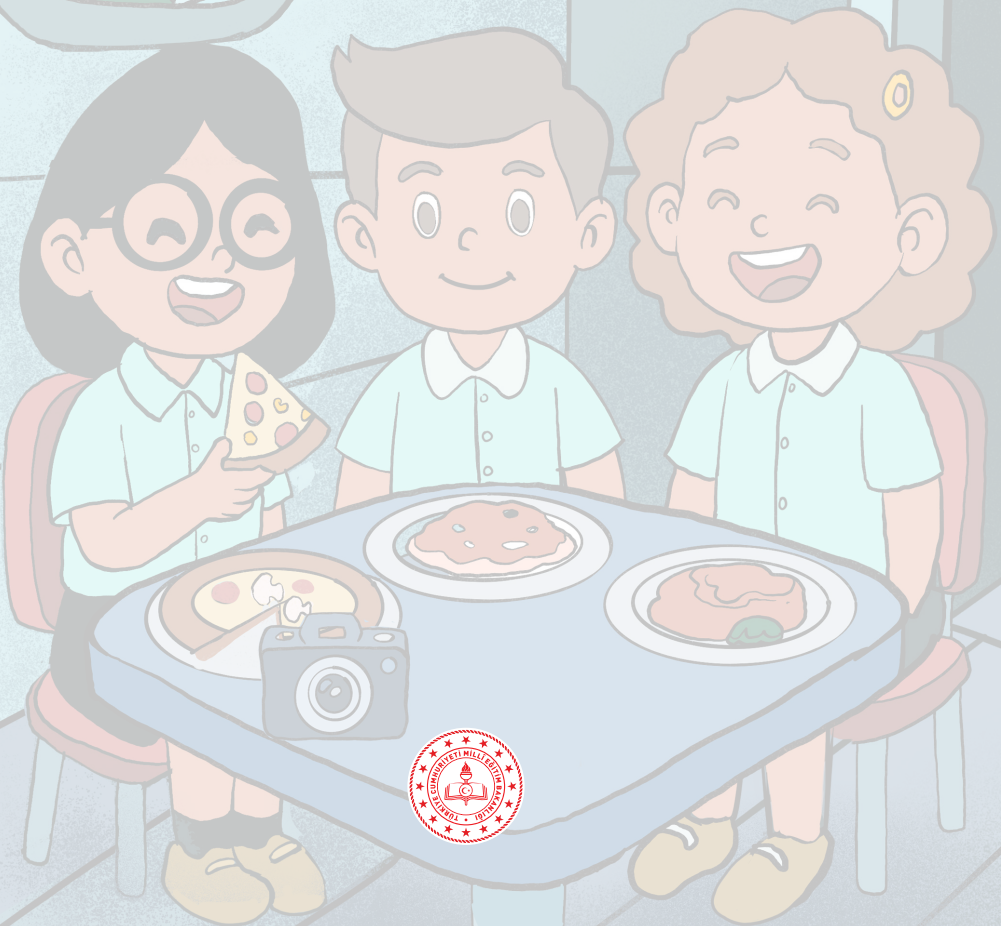

aeroplane (n): an aircraft that flies in the sky

bakery (n): a place where bread and cakes are made or sold

balcony (n): a small outside area on an upper floor of a building

barbecue (n): an outdoor meal or gathering at which meat, fish, or other food is grilled over an open fire

boil (v): to cook vegetables, rice, eggs, etc. in boiling water

bus station (n): a place where buses pick up and drop off passengers

celebration (n): a special, enjoyable event where people praise or enjoy something

chit chat (n): informal conversation about unimportant things

cinema (n): a building where films are shown

concert hall (n): a large room or building used for

musical performances

creamy (adj): having a smooth, soft texture like cream

cuisine (n): a style or method of cooking, especially associated with a particular country or region

dessert (n): sweet food eaten at the end of a meal

dumpling (n): a small ball of dough, often boiled or steamed

experience (n): something that happens to you or something you do and learn from

fire station (n): a building where firefighters work and keep their equipment

fizzy drink (n): a drink with bubbles

flower crown (n): a decorative ring of flowers worn on the head

someone to do something by giving reasons or convincing them

post office (n): a place to send letters and packages

railway station (n): a place where trains stop for passengers to get on or off

refreshing (adj): pleasantly fresh or restoring energy

roast (v): to cook food, especially meat, in an oven or over a fire

shopping centre (n): a large building or area containing many shops

spice (n): a substance (like pepper or cinnamon) added to food for flavour

steak (n): a thick slice of meat or beef

sugar free (adj): not containing sugar

sweet (adj): with a sugar taste
